Therefore let all the faithful pray to you while you may be found (Ps. 32:6).

he Psalmist implies that there comes a time when God cannot be found. A time when God hides Himself. A time that I believe may have begun in America.

Our nation is in turmoil. Why? Could it be because America is losing God's blessing? His favor? Could our sin be provoking His judgment? Judgment that is not necessarily in the form of a nuclear dirty bomb, or another ISIS attack, or an economic collapse. But a Romans 1 judgment as God backs out of our national life and turns us over to ourselves.

In the Old Testament, God moved in judgment on His own beloved nation of Judah. His judgment of Judah was a 22-year process. God moved slowly, giving plenty of opportunity for Judah to repent of her sin, turn to Him, and therefore escape the judgment. But with all of God's warnings, Judah became even more defiant. More disobedient. More wicked.

She insisted on her right to immorality and idolatry. In the end, God became her enemy. He sent in the Babylonians to destroy Jerusalem, the temple, and the people. Those who were not taken captive were slaughtered in the streets (2 Chron. 36:15–19).

God warns a nation that judgment is coming. He doesn't want any to perish. But if a nation does not heed His warnings, He unleashes His anger and there is nothing—no one—who can prevent it. If God would judge His own beloved nation of Judah, why would we think America could escape?

So, if we are coming under the judgment of God—if He is giving us over to ourselves, removing His blessing, protection, and favor—the solution will not be found in politics or the economy or the military or technology. The solution will be found on our knees as we humble ourselves, pray, seek God's face, and repent of our sin. Then we must plead for Him to return to us as we return to Him.

Now is the time to get serious about

### KNOW YOUR GOD-FEARING LEADERS

s we approach this year's National Day of Prayer on May 4, we urge intercessors to continue focused prayer on government leaders in the new White House administration.

Betsy DeVos is the Secretary of Education. Born Elisabeth Prince in Holland, MI, "Betsy" grew up in a family of Dutch descendants who were members of the Christian Reformed Church. She attended a Christian high school and then Calvin College where she found a passion for civic involvement. She married Dick Devos, a businessman and entrepreneur, whose father built the Amway corporation. Both have a rich heritage of faith and conservative values.

According to <u>Politico</u> magazine, "... one constant is the DeVos family's devout Christian beliefs." In a 2001 interview, DeVos revealed her Christian worldview: "Our desire is to ... confront the culture in which we all live today in ways which will continue to advance



God's kingdom."

She and her husband believe the Church needs to get more involved in community affairs and education in order to return to our God-fearing roots as a nation. They have also been strong supporters of family and pro-life issues. It is clear DeVos is a leader with both core biblical beliefs as well as the long-term vision to bring lasting change.

Kellyanne Conway serves as Counselor to President Trump. Conway, who turned 50 on Inauguration Day, was raised in an Italian Catholic family by her mother, grandmother, and two aunts after her parents divorced at age three. Living on a farm and learning the value of hard work, she states, "Everything I learned about life and business started on that farm." Conway says her worldview was shaped in a home "where family and faith and self-reliance were premier. We were not encouraged or allowed to complain or talk about what we didn't have."

She graduated from Trinity College in Washington, D.C., and later earned her law degree. In 2001, she married George T. Conway III, a New York lawyer, and they now have four young children.

A longtime pro-life activist, she was invited to speak at the 2017 March for Life. "Kellyanne has been a prominent fixture in the conservative and pro-life movement for years," said Kristen Hawkins, president of Students for Life of America, "lending her wisdom and expertise to the good causes of many candidates and organizations. She understands the value of protecting innocent life and communicating that message effectively." She also stands with Israel and boldly defends the biblical definition of marriage.

"Faith plays a minute by minute part of my life. It is constant," Conway says. During the height of the presidential campaign, she clarified her perspective on all the high-level activity and notoriety: "This is consequential, this is exciting, and historic in its own way, but it is nothing compared to the universe in which we live, the God that I worship, and the totality of our lives."

**Reince Priebus** is President Trump's new Chief of Staff. Priebus is a member of St. Sophia's Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Washington, D.C. He also maintains dual participation at Grace Church. Life-long friend John Binkley states that [Priebus] "was passionately focused on his

repentance and prayer.

God promises: You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart (Jer. 29:13). There can be no casual, half-hearted turning to God—not if we want Him to return to us. God emphasizes this principle in Joel 2:12–14: "Even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning." Rend your heart and not your garments. . . . Who knows? He may turn and have pity and leave behind a blessing.

Some of the prayers and calls for repentance that I have heard within the Church or at prayer events seem to be a rending of garments—an outward show to impress. There is a sense of going through the motions of repentance. But the pleading seems to be contrived and hollow instead of broken-hearted and contrite.

Only God knows those who are rending their hearts as they seek Him. But I am led to ask myself: how truly serious am I about seeking God on behalf of our nation? When was the last time I fasted and wept and mourned and confessed the sin of our nation as though it were my own? I believe the future of America hangs on the answer that His people give to those questions.


marriage, on his career, on his faith. His faith was something very important to him."

May 1, 2016, Priebus gave an official message as chairman of the Republican National Committee (RNC), wishing "Orthodox Christians around the world a happy and blessed Easter." He added, "Just as the first Christians praised God at the sight of the empty tomb, we too praise our good and merciful God today for his victory over the grave."

In a 2013 interview with Pat Robertson of CBN, Priebus spoke freely about his faith: "What you will see is a party that embraces life, a party that embraces marriage, and a chairman that understands that there's only one sovereign God." Priebus is a born-and-bred conservative whose mantra is, "Win every day, live the mission every day, wait on God's timing and good things happen."

Former senior pastor of Grace Church, Jerry Worsham, often gave Priebus stories to read about Abraham Lincoln and William Wilberforce, who were not only politicians, but also active evangelical Christians. Worsham's wife Jane recalled that whenever her husband gave a message on leadership, Priebus sought him out. "He knew that's what he was and what he was designed to do. He just wanted to do it in the right way," she said.

In each of these leaders, it is evident they are serving a higher call in this hour. Our prayers can help assure the fulfillment of that call.

#### TRUMP'S 1ST ADDRESS TO CONGRESS

President Donald Trump addressed a badly divided nation following an intense election. Both sides applauded his comments on civil rights and childcare. But immigration and Obamacare repeal brought jeers. He vowed to destroy ISIS and reiterated his support of Israel. The greatest applause was for Carryn Owens, widow of U.S. Navy Special Operator William "Ryan" Owens (killed in Yemen). CNN's liberal news contributor Van Jones said that Trump's recognition of Owen's widow was "one of the most extraordinary moments you have ever seen in American politics." "[Trump] became President of the United States in that moment, period. . . . If he finds a way to do that over and over again, he's going to be there for eight years." (BCN)

#### **TARGET SHARES PLUMMET**



Target was hit by its third straight quarter of lower sales from existing stores. The stock has lost a quarter of its value since the holiday shopping

season started in November, back to levels last seen in August 2014. Several conservative organizations campaigned for families to take their business elsewhere because of Target's decision to allow people to choose the restroom that corresponds with their gender identity. (CP)
